## 1 Mathildenanlage

The *Mathildenanlage* represents a historical sight right in the middle of the unspoilt nature. Its specific characteristics are the hiking trails with more than 600 steps as well as the resting places made of stone situated on a mountain slope at the lower *Emberger Kopf*. This unique site was named after the first queen of the state, Charlotte Auguste Mathilde von Württemberg (1766 – 1828).



## 6 Bad Teinach Open-Air Pool

The modernised outdoor swimming pool has a unique family atmosphere. Especially the toddler area and the water slide make children's hearts beat faster. Visitors particularly appreciate the well-maintained facilities and the delightful hillside location with its large car park, which is free of charge.



## 11 Zavelstein Museum of Local History

The little museum that was inaugurated in March 2000 encompasses 8 themes: the history of the little town and how it fits into history as a whole, the administration of "town and office", trades and livelihood in and around Zavelstein, the role of the forest, household and habitation, religion and church, the importance of the school, the development of Bad Teinach and balneotherapy in general and – in the coach house – the role of agriculture.

## 2 Bad Teinach Trinity Church with Kabbalistic Triptych Painting

The Protestant Trinity Church in Bad Teinach is home to an exceptional 17<sup>th</sup> century piece of art: the Kabbalistic triptych painting by Princess Antonia of Württemberg. Groups and individual visitors come from all over the world to admire this large shrine in the choir of the church and to be guided deeper into the contexts of the Holy Scripture as depicted here. With a guided tour you will be initiated into the secrets of the triptych painting.



## 4 Pasta manufactory in Bad Teinach

You are invited to have a look behind the scenes of the pasta manufactory in Bad Teinach. Watch how pasta, chocolate delicacies and other culinary treats are made by hand using the best ingredients. In the pasta manufactory you can find all sorts of products to give as presents or enjoy yourself. Fragrant farmhouse bread and wholemeal loaves await you on the bread-baking days, Wednesdays and Fridays.



## 3 Bad Teinach Mineral Spa

Bad Teinach's mineral spa, which was freshly renovated in 2015, offers you two large pools – one indoors and one outdoors – with plenty of opportunities to relax. The warm thermal water provides prophylactic support in the case of spinal and joint complaints. The large Börlind beauty area will leave nothing to be desired.

## 5 Bad Teinach Miniature Golf Course

In Bad Teinach you encounter a very pleasantly situated miniature golf course with 18 holes. During a short break you can treat yourself to ice cream and drinks from the kiosk. The miniature golf course is open from Easter until the end of September.

## 8 God's Acre in Zavelstein

"God's Acre" in Zavelstein has been the burial place for the parish of Zavelstein ever since 1569. As its usage gradually petered out after the new woodland cemetery was established, it was redesignated in 2012 as a "place of remembrance". Since 2012 Bad Teinach-Zavelstein also has a natural woodland burial site for urn interments.



## 9 Little Town of Zavelstein

Many important historical events have left clearly recognisable marks on Zavelstein and tell fascinating stories: the colonisation by the Alemanni, the splendour of the Staufer dynasty, the influence of the top-ranking Württemberg diplomat Benjamin Buwington von Wallmerode and the devastation of the Nine Years' War. Immerse yourself and be enchanted by the fascinating history of what was once the smallest town in Württemberg.

## 10 Zavelstein Forge

For centuries, a community without a smith was rare. The smith was the most important craftsman in the parish. Nowadays local smiths have disappeared. What remains is a mere distant memory of soot-covered men with their leather aprons who made the anvil ring amidst flying sparks. In house number 13 in the old town centre ("im Städtle") a forge has been reconstructed on the basis of a traditional model.



## 12 Zavelstein Castle Ruins

The castle keep, which dates back to the Staufer era to around 1230 provides a magnificent view across the heights of the Northern Black Forest with the Teinach valley below and the Gäu district over on the other side of the river Nagold. After the family Buwington von Wallmerode had to sell their sovereignty of Zavelstein back to Württemberg in 1710, the castle was no longer maintained and fell into disrepair. From 1695 onwards the houses were rebuilt, whereas the castle has to this day remained a ruin.



## 15 Crocus Blossom in Zavelstein

Zavelstein is widely known for its crocus blossom. The "Crocus napolitanus" is actually indigenous to the Mediterranean region. From around the beginning of March the warm spring sunshine entices around 1 million flowers from out of the ground in all shades ranging from bluish violet to white. The origins of the wild crocus are the subject of many stories and legends, which you can hear all about on the guided tour.



## 18 St. Candidus Church in Kentheim

When settlement of the Northern Black Forest began in around the year 900, the first little church of the region was built in Kentheim probably even before the turn of the millenium and dedicated to St. Candidus. It is one of the oldest churches in Württemberg; its interior and its exterior have hardly changed in over a thousand years.
